Prince of Peace Nursery School Receives Community Grant

Prince of Peace Nursery School has received a mini –grant to fund the creation of an Outdoor Science Investigation Bin which would contain tools to encourage scientific study. The bin would be part of the school's science curriculum for children ages 4 & 5 but would also be used by the entire school community.
