INVASIVE SPECIES: EDUCATION AND REMOVAL BROOKFIELD CONSERVATION SOCIETY



In the month of November 2022, the Brookfield Education Foundation funded a major grant called Invasive Species: Education and Removal aimed at educating the community about the removal, prevention [and hopefully the eradication] of Invasive plant/tree species. This grant was championed by the Brookfield Conservation Society.

Our local ecosystem, forests and open spaces are adversely affected by the rapid spread of non-native plant and tree species. This project will empower the Brookfield community by giving it the tools needed to combat the invaders. Through a series of instructions (in person or virtual), informational signage and volunteer opportunities, residents of all ages will have the tools needed to recognize the invasive species, learn how to properly remove and replace them to effectively stop their spread. This grant also made provisions for the purchase of materials needed to facilitate this effort: native plants/flowers, mulch, gardening tools, fencing etc.

BUILDING A CULTURE OF COMMUNITY AND LITERACY WITH THE POWER OF STORYTELLING

WHISCONIER MIDDLE SCHOOL







The Building a Culture of Community and Literacy with the Power of Storytelling project will offer a series of in-school presentations and breakout sessions for Brookfield students in 5th-8th grades, and one community-wide event with acclaimed author Sherri L. Smith. Championed by Jennifer Brown, Library Media Specialist, Whisconier Middle School, this two-day event will bring together students, parents and the greater community to highlight the importance of building a culture of community and literacy with the power storytelling. Having the chance to hear from and work with an established author will inspire students not only to read more, but to write more, thus increasing their literacy skills. Writers will have the opportunity to workshop their writing with an established awardwinning author who is also a professor of creative writing at Hamline University. Stakeholders in the community will learn more about the importance of literacy and how they can instill a love for reading and writing from an early age and maintain it through the years. By offering this opportunity, the library can bridge the gap between classroom learning and realworld experiences from an author who has captured the attention of readers across a wide range of ages and interests.

GRANT APPLICATION TIPS

Here are some tips for a successful grant application based on our nearly 2 decades of experience.



Partner with the BEF Board to learn about the application process and how to develop a successful application.



Research previously awarded grants on the BEF website to spark creative ideas and to ensure your idea is new.



Be thorough in writing your application, ensuring you answer all the questions on the form.



Investigate the costs associated with your program and provide a detailed budget in your application.



Be prepared to discuss your ideas with the Board as part of the review process.

CORE GRANT REVIEW CRITERIA

Program must enhance education for any group in the Brookfield community (our grants are not limited to the schools).

Program must be innovative - it must provide something new that does not already exist for the target group.

Program must have a person to champion the program, a committed partner who will see it through.
