


THANKS FOR GIVING GALA

ORIGAMI BASICS PROGRAM

THE BROOKFIELD CRAFT CENTER | Champion: William Chen (Troop 5)

The Brookfield Education Foundation funded a grant request from William Chen, Troop 5, Brookfield, to launch an origami program at the Brookfield Craft Center as part of his Eagle Scout project. The program involved a 3-hour class where students were introduced to different styles of origami, the history and cultural component of origami, and basic folding skills. Participants tested their new skills by working on 4 different origami projects. Plans are underway to arrange for future workshops.



EMOTION INTO ART

ANDREA BEATY THEMATIC UNIT

CANDLEWOOD LAKE ELEMENTARY - 2ND GRADE | Champion: Jennifer Pink

The BEF has funded a program at CLES to support a book study of books by author, Andrea Beaty for 2nd graders. The selected books emphasize important learning lessons related to courage, perseverance, problem solving, and acceptance. The unit will be complemented by a field trip to the Ridgefield Playhouse to see <u>Ada Twist Scientist and Friends</u>, and a joint reading exercise with families at home of <u>Rosie Revere and the Raucous Riveters</u>.

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CURRENT ISSUES WITH ART GOTTLIEB

The Brookfield Education Foundation funded an initiative to offer the senior community six discussion sessions on the nation's current issues. Facilitated by historian, social worker, and veteran, Art Gottlieb, the program provided a safe venue for open, engaging discussion of current events and issues in a non-judgmental environment.



CLIMATE, EARTH, ENVIRONMENT

BROOKFIELD SENIOR CENTER | Champion: Amy Diezemann

This program offered a four-part lecture series on Climate, our Earth, and the Environment. The lectures were conducted by Dr. Stephen Mitchell Wagener, Climate Change Educator, Ecologist and Professor of Biology at Western CT State University. This series offered engaging programming on an introductory topic level to seniors in the Brookfield community, providing an opportunity for life-long learning in an open, welcoming environment.



BRAIN AND BODY FITNESS

The "Brain and Body Fitness" program brings a unique angle to exercising the brain and connecting the brain with the body through fitness at the Brookfield Senior Center.
